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



Remember to register for Fall Semester 2018 Session 1 and 3-credit classes during the registration period of *April 17 through August 2*. Two things happen if you wait to register until late registration period from *August 3 to August 9*:

- 1. The Registrar will need to enroll you; and
- 2. A late fee will be added to your invoice of \$10 per credit hour.

Register early! And remember to purchase your textbooks so you'll have them when classes start on August 14.



Fall Semester 2018 begins on August 14th and runs through December 10th. Our Fall Break Week is scheduled for October 9th through October 15th and Session 2 will begin on October 16th. You will be notified by email of when Session 2 registration opens in early September.

Summit University is offering 11 courses for Fall Semester 2018! You can view a list of these courses in the SU Course Catalog on the Fall Semester 2018 Page. Students are encouraged to register early for required courses in your program. Unlike past fall semesters, five courses will not be offered this fall but will be offered in Fall Semester 2019. These courses include:

- MINS 1650 MSC-B Intensive
- EDUC 1233 Foundations of a Home-Centered Spiritual Culture
- EDUC 1380 Outreach Principles and Techniques in the Summit Lighthouse
- MINS 2110 Homiletics 2
- POLI 1101 Spiritual Principles of Government

MSC-B students who are preparing to take MINS 1650 are requested to take the prerequisites for the ministerial intensive this fall and plan on attending in October 2019!

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Mentoring Requirements

- MSC-B students can register for MINS 1000 after completing 6 program credits
- MTC-B students can register for MINS 2000 after completing 9 program credits


Some programs require students to be mentored for a semester by an ordained minister in Church Universal and Triumphant. Students in these programs can fulfill this requirement by taking the MINS mentoring course for their program (MINS 1000 or MINS 2000) during the semester of their choosing once they have fulfilled the prerequisite credit hours. MSC-B students are elligible to take MINS 1000 after completing 6 program credits. MTC-B students can take MINS 2000 after completing 9 program credits.

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Counseling and Counseling Requirements

- Both MSC-B and MTC-B programs have a counseling requirement
 - MSC-B: 5 professional counseling sessions
 - MTC-B: 10 professional counseling sessions

Both the MSC-B program and the Level 2 MTC-B program require counseling hours with a licensed psychological counselor/therapist. The MSC-B program requires a minimum of 5 professional counseling sessions and the MTC-B program requires a minimum of 10 sessions (in addition to the sessons taken for the MSC-B program). To avoid a conflict of interest while in either program, students are requested to not counsel with fellow SU students. Students may deduct sessions taken in the past 3 years. For a list of recommended counselors, please contact the SU Registrar, Karen Brewer, at registrar@SummitUniversity.org. These counselors are also available for personal counseling.



During your time at Summit University's School of Theology, you will most likely be required to take a class that involves creating and uploading a video assignment. We've created Moodle 103: Uploading Video Assignments to help you with the video assignment submission process. For students taking COMS 1101 Public Speaking and MINS 1110 and MINS 2110 Homiletics 1 and 2, this is the tutorial for you. Moodle 103 appears under your class list once you sign up for any of these three classes. Plan on completing Moodle 103 before you start your class. You'll be a pro at uploading video assignments once you practice and follow the Moodle 103 instructions!
