Classes	When to Register
Session 1 and 3-credit classes	April 22 – August 8
Late Registration (Session 1 and 3-credit classes)	August 9-15
Session 2 classes	September 3 – October 7

Registration for Fall Semester 2019 Session 1, 2-credit and 3-credit classes will take place April 22nd through August 8th. That may sound like a long time, but we encourage you to register early and buy your textbooks to avoid late fees and not having your textbooks by the time classes start. Late registration closes on August 8th and Fall classes begin on August 20th. Session 2 registration opens on September 3rd.

Register early! And remember to purchase your textbooks so you'll have them when classes start on August 20th.

Deferring Courses Policy	
Week of Class	Options
During Week 1	Drop classes <i>No financial/transcript penalties</i>
Weeks 2-4	Defer classes <i>\$50 deferral fee, no transcript penalty</i>
Weeks 5-8/17	Two Options: 1) Incomplete – <i>Can petition under certain circumstances</i> 2) Withdrawal – <i>Forfeit tuition/fees, permanent "W" on transcript</i>

As a reminder, you can Drop a class without penalty during Week 1 of the class. After the first week, there are financial and/or transcript penalties for deferring or withdrawing from a class. Should you need to leave a class part way through the semester, your options depend on how far into the class you are.

During Weeks 2-4, you can Defer your class, meaning that you will be charged a \$50 deferral fee, but your tuition and fees for the class will be credited to your account and you will not see the class appear on your transcript for that semester.

If you wait until Week 5 to leave a class, you can petition for an Incomplete or Withdraw from the class. In order to petition for an Incomplete, a student must have completed at least 75 percent of their work for the class and demonstrate a hardship that prevents the completion of the class on time. Instructors will review petitions on a case-by-case basis. If granted, the student receives a new date to complete the remaining portion of his or her class work.

If you are not eligible for an Incomplete, or your petition is denied, you can Withdraw from the class, receive a “W” on your transcript and re-take the class in a future semester, forfeiting your tuition and fees for the class.

Weeks 5-8/17: <i>I/W Period</i>	Begins Sept. 17	Begins Nov. 19

This chart shows these important dates for Fall Semester 2019. As you can see, the dates for each period depend on when the class begins. It is important to be mindful of these dates as you begin your courses. Should you need to drop, defer or withdraw a course, contact the Registrar immediately for assistance so that you don't miss an important timeline.

And here's a look at the Fall 2019 Course Offerings. Many of you have been waiting to take LEAD 1101 Principles and Practices of Servant Leadership and MINS 2110 Homiletics 2. We are happy to announce that *both* courses are being offered this fall! We are also offering RELS 1005 Survey of the World Religions. MSC-B students who have taken or are enrolled in the required courses for the MSC-B ministerial intensive can plan on attending the MINS 1650 Pastoral Assistance ministerial intensive this fall. The intensive is a four-day ministering servant training course and will be offered October 15-18, 2019 at the Royal Teton Ranch directly after the Harvest Conference.



Fall Semester registration will be opening on April 22. During each registration period, many students contact the Registrar to ask which courses they need to graduate. Did you know that *you* can access the same report the Registrar uses to answer your registration questions? To do this, open your Orbund start page and click on **“Reports”** on the lefthand side of the page. Then click on **“Graduation Requirements.”** Your personalized Graduation Requirements report will appear.



To understand how the report is used, please look at this slide showing the Graduation Requirements report for an MTC-B ministerial training student. You'll notice there are 3 sections on this report:

1. Pre-Intensive Requirements (required courses)
2. Other Requirements (required courses)
3. Electives (elective courses)

These 3 sections list the “Required” and “Elective” courses that this student needs to graduate. Keep in mind that if you are enrolled in another certificate program such as leadership or general studies, your Graduation Requirements report will only list two sections showing the “Required” and “Elective” courses needed to graduate. Once you see the remaining courses you need to graduate, the next step is to check the Academic Calendar on the righthand side of your Orbund Start Page to see which courses are being offered during the next semester.



You can keep track of all the important registration, drop and deferral period dates by checking the Academic Calendar, which you can access from the SU Student Portal Dashboard.
