**Registration for Fall Semester 2021 Session 1, 2-credit and 3-credit classes will take place April 26th through August 5th.** That may sound like a long time, but we encourage you to register early and buy your textbooks or e-textbooks to avoid late fees and not having your textbooks by the time classes start. Late registration closes on August 12th and Fall Semester classes begin on August 17th. Session 2 registration opens on August 31st.

**Register early!** And remember to purchase your textbooks so you'll have them when classes start on August 17<sup>th</sup>.



As a reminder, you can Drop a class without penalty during Week 1 of the class. After the first week, there are financial and/or transcript penalties for deferring or withdrawing from a class. Should you need to leave a class part way through the semester, your options depend on how far into the class you are.

**During Weeks 2-4, you can Defer your class**, meaning that you will be charged a \$50 deferral fee, but your tuition and fees for the class will be credited to your account and you will not see the class appear on your transcript for that semester.

If you wait until Week 5 to leave a class, you can petition for an Incomplete or Withdraw from the class. In order to petition for an Incomplete, a student must have completed at least 75 percent of their work for the class and demonstrate a hardship that prevents the completion of the class on time. Instructors will review petitions on a case-by-case basis. If granted, the student receives a new date to complete the remaining portion of his or her class work.

If you are not eligible for an Incomplete, or your petition is denied, you can Withdraw from the class, receive a "W" on your transcript and re-take the class in a future semester, forfeiting your tuition and fees for the class.



This chart shows these important dates for Fall Semester 2021. As you can see, the dates for each period depend on when the class begins. It is important to be mindful of these dates as you begin your courses. Should you need to drop, defer or withdraw a course, contact the Registrar immediately for assistance so that you don't miss an important timeline.



**Fall Semester 2021 begins on August 17<sup>th</sup> and runs through December 13<sup>th</sup>.** Our Fall Break Week is scheduled for October 12th through October 18th and **Session 2 will begin on October 19**. Session 2 registration opens on August 31st and ends on October 4th.

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Let's take a look at the two NEW Writing Courses! ENGL 1225 English Writing Skills is a 1-
credit skills training course that teaches the principles of good English writing. This is a great course for
those of you who are looking to brush up on your English writing or improve your English writing if
English is not your native language. ENGL 1225 will be offered during Session 1 of Fall Semester.
Registration is open now for ENGL 1225.



ENGL 1275 Web Content Development is a 1-credit course that will focus on how to write captivating content for the internet and social media. ENGL 1275 is a Session 2 course. Registration for Session 2 courses will open on August 31st.

You can take either ENGL 1225 or ENGL 1275 for audit or credit. If you take these courses for academic credit, both new courses count towards the required 3 credits of "writing electives" in the Writers' Guild Certificate program. # **MERCURY WRITERS' GUILD**



**The Mercury Writers' Guild is starting to ZOOM!** On April 22, the Guild had its first monthly Zoom meeting, featuring an interview with Guild member and author Lois Drake and a lively conversation about the future of the Guild. If you are a Guild member and missed this first meeting, be sure to check out the recording in the Guild area in Moodle.

**Not a Writers' Guild member yet?** We'd love to have you join us! Please contact the Registrar for details on qualifying for the Guild and how to join. Dues are \$5 a month that are paid as a one-time annual fee, which helps cover SU's website costs. And if you are eligible for Guild membership, but missed the opportunity to join in January, don't worry! There's still time to join us. Just contact the Registrar for details on how to pay your membership dues.

### **MSC-B and MTC-B Electives Updates**

We have some special updates for MSC-B and MTC-B students. The SOCW electives requirement has been changed. MSC-B students will now take SOCW 2603 Basics of Senior Care as a required course. And MTC-B students will take SOCW 2605 End-of-Life Care in The Summit Lighthouse as a required course. This change applies to all MSC-B and MTC-B students who have not yet taken a SOCW course, as well as future students. Students in these programs who have already taken SOCW electives will still receive credit towards their program.



To compensate for this elective change, MSC-B and MTC-B students can now choose from additional electives to satisfy the 2-credit elective requirements of both programs. Here are the expanded elective choices:

•	LEAD 2105 – Practical Leadership Skills 2 (1 cr.) (MTC-B level only)
•	POLI 1101 – Spiritual Principles of Government (3 cr.)

- ENGL 1275 Web Content Development
- ENGL 1281 Writers' Guild Training Fundamentals (2 cr.)
- LEAD 1105 Practical Leadership Skills 1 (1 cr.)
- LEAD 2105 Practical Leadership Skills 2 (1 cr.) (MTC-B level only)
- POLI 1101 Spiritual Principles of Government (3 cr.)

Stay tuned for additional electives to be added to both programs! Those of you in other programs may also see these additional courses appear in your elective options.

# **MTC-B COUNSELING REQUIREMENT**

**The MTC-B counseling requirement has also been updated.** MTC-B students now have *additional time* to complete the 10 required sessions. The new policy reads: "MTC-B students must complete a minimum of 10 professional counseling sessions by a licensed psychological counselor/therapist (in addition to sessions taken for the MSC-B program) taken within 5 years of applying for the office of lay minister."

To report your hours, please follow the instructions on the MTC-B Counseling Confirmation letter. These instructions request that you ask your counselor to send an email letter on your behalf to the SU Registrar confirming the dates of the ten counseling sessions and the professional credentials and contact information of the counselor.

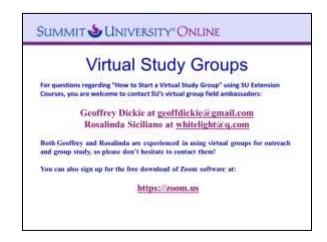
# ZOOM OUTREACH USING SU GROUP EXTENSION COURSES

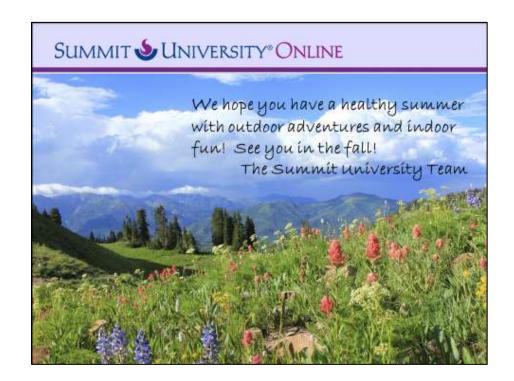
