SPRING 2023 REGISTRATION:

Spring 2023 Registration				
Classes	When to Register			
Session 1 and 3-credit classes	November 21 to December 23			
Late Registration (Session 1 and 3-credit classes)	December 24 to December 30			
Session 2 classes	January 24 to February 27			

Registration for Spring Semester 2023 Session 1, 2-credit and 3-credit classes will take place November 21 through December 23. That may sound like a long time, but we encourage you to register early and buy your textbooks to avoid late fees and not having your textbooks by the time classes start. Late registration closes on December 30 and Spring Semester classes begin on January 10, 2023. Session 2 registration opens on January 24.

Register early! And remember to purchase your textbooks so you'll have them when classes start on January 10.

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Deferring Courses Policy					
Week of Class	Options				
During Week 1	Drop classes No financial/transcript penalties				
Weeks 2-4	Defer classes \$50 deferral fee, no transcript penalty				
Weeks 5-8/17	 Two Options: 1) Incomplete – Can petition under certain circumstances 2) Withdrawal – Forfeit tuition/fees, permanent "W" on transcript 				

As a reminder, you can DROP a class without penalty during Week 1 of the class. After the first week, there are financial and/or transcript penalties for deferring or withdrawing from a class. Should you need to leave a class part way through the semester, your options depend on how far into the class you are.

During Weeks 2-4, you can DEFER your class, meaning that you will be charged a \$50 deferral fee, but your tuition and fees for the class will be credited to your account and you will not see the class appear on your transcript for that semester.

If you wait until Week 5 to leave a class, you can petition for an INCOMPLETE or WITHDRAW from the class. In order to petition for an Incomplete, a student must have completed at least 75 percent of their work for the class and demonstrate a hardship that prevents the completion of the class on time.

Instructors will review petitions on a case-by-case basis. If granted, the student receives a new date to complete the remaining portion of his or her class work.

If you are not eligible for an Incomplete, or your petition is denied, you can Withdraw from the class, receive a "W" on your transcript and re-take the class in a future semester, forfeiting your tuition and fees for the class.

This chart shows these important dates for Spring Semester 2023. As you can see, the dates for each period depend on when the class begins. It is important to be mindful of these dates as you begin your courses. Should you need to drop, defer or withdraw a course, contact the Registrar immediately for assistance so that you don't miss an important timeline.



Spring Semester 2023 begins on January 10 and runs through May 8. Our Spring Break Week is scheduled for March 7 through March 13 and Session 2 will begin on March 14.

MTC-B MINISTERIAL INTENSIVE UPDATE

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MTC-B Students – plan ahead for 2024!

- MINS 2650: *The Aquarian-Age Minister* has been postposed to March 2024 at the Inner Retreat in Corwin Springs, Montana.
- Prerequisites: MINS 2110, PSYS 2201, MINS 2610 and MINS2780.
- MINS 2110 Homiletics 2 and MINS 2780 CUT Sacraments must be completed before Spring Semester 2024.

MTC-B ministerial studies students are encouraged to plan ahead to attend the MTC-B Intensive: The Aquarian-Age Minister in 2024 at the Inner Retreat in Corwin Springs, Montana. SU has decided to schedule the next MTC-B intensive in 2024, as more MTC-B students will be eligible to attend and the larger class size will provide for a better learning experience.

MINS 2650 is now scheduled to be offered March 5 - 8, 2024 at the Inner Retreat. Prerequisites include MINS 2110, MINS 2610, MINS 2780 and PSYS 2201. Students may be enrolled in a prerequisite during spring semester 2024 to attend (not including MINS 2110 or MINS 2780). MINS 2110 Homiletics 2 and MINS 2780 on the Sacraments must be completed prior to attending the intensive. Attendance at the MINS 2650 ministerial intensive is required to graduate from the MTC-B program. Further details and information will be sent to the MTC-B students.

WRITING STUDENTS – SPRING SEMESTER 2023 UPDATE

For Spring Semester 2023, a new course has been added as a "non-writing elective" component of the Writers' Guild Certificate (WGC) program. POLI 1101 Spiritual Principles of Government is now an eligible courses to satisfy the required "non-writing elective" of 1-credit.

POLI 1101 is comprehensive course on the history and philsophy of God-Government from golden age eras to present day political movements. The 3-credit academic course includes several writing assignments that provide a good framework for writing students to refine and improve their writing skills in the area of political science. Please keep in mind that only 1 of the 3 credits of this course will apply towards your program "non-writing elective" requirement.

SU is also offering other writing program courses this spring semester, including RELS 1080 Teachings of the Ascended Masters (3 cr.), a required course for the Writers Guild Certificate Program, and ENGL 1225 English Writing Skills (1 cr.) which will be offered during session 2.

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Writing Students - Spring Semester update!

- WGC students: POLI 1101 Spiritual Principles of Government (3 cr.) has been added as a "non-writing elective."
- RELS 1080 Understanding the Teachings of the Ascended Masters (3 cr.), a required WGC program course, will be offered.
- ENGL 1225 English Writing Skills (1 cr.) will be offered during session 2 which starts on March 14.
